



## Chief Executive Officer's report 2012/2013

I am pleased to report on the 2012/2013 year of the Blue Haven Retirement Village and Aged Care Facility.

The annual accounts for the Blue Haven Retirement Village and Aged Care Facility are provided in the Annual Report and show that both entities remain financially healthy.

Last year I advised of the alteration of the aged care funding instrument that applies to the Nursing Home and Hostel. The Federal Government alteration of the funding instrument has affected the resident classifications and resulted in a reduction in income. With the aged care industry, Council will continue to lobby the Federal Government to ensure funding remains adequate.

The financial statement for the Blue Haven Retirement Village reports that there is a good surplus in place to address the necessary repairs and maintenance related costs that may arise in the future.

Major works to be undertaken this financial year include a major upgrade of the Stage 2 lift and the upgrade of the Vitacall system.

A major challenge during the past year was the storm and tornado damage and the repair and recovery. It was very pleasing that despite significant winds, fallen trees and damage to buildings, that no resident and staff member received serious injury. The response of residents, staff and caretakers in participating in the clean up and ensuring that care to residents continued was superb.

The ongoing care provided to residents of the Aged Care Facility is excellent. I thank and congratulate the Director of Community Services, Clare Rogers, Director of Nursing, Sonja King, Deputy Director of Nursing, Helen McInerney, Hostel Supervisor, Avril Elliott, Administration Manager, Linda Humphries and the staff for their hard work, commitment and dedication.

The provision of training opportunities at Blue Haven continue with positive relationships with the University of Wollongong, TAFE and Kiama High School.

The proposed redevelopment of the Aged Care Facility at the preferred Kiama Hospital site has made significant progress with negotiations with the Illawarra/Shoalhaven Local Health District nearing

finalization. Funding support from the NSW Government \$100M Restart NSW Illawarra Infrastructure Fund is being sought to assist the feasibility of the project.

The project will lead to a centre of aged care excellence with the Illawarra/Shoalhaven Local Health District Primary and Community Health Care Services being co-located with the new Aged Care Facility and Council's Community Aged Care Services.

The Friends of Blue Haven continue to provide excellent support for the residents of the Blue Haven Aged Care Facility. The annual fete organised by the Friends of Blue Haven was highly successful and exceeded expectations. During the past year the Friends of Blue Haven have donated \$7,000 towards 6 new electric beds and \$4,000 for the recovering of chairs in the dining room and activity room. Donations have also been made for the purchase of new trolleys for the laundry while the Friends of Blue Haven also continue to give monthly financial support for the purchase of materials etc for recreational activity programs held at the Hostel and Nursing Home.

The Manager of the Independent Living Units, Mr Steve Dawson and the caretakers, John and Dianne Mortimer, Graham and Glenda Tuohy and David and Michele Harrison continue to provide excellent service and I thank the manner in which they liaise with the residents and respond to the residents' needs and concerns. During and following the storm and tornado, Mr Steve Dawson and the caretakers worked extremely hard to ensure that residents' safety was protected and repairs were carried out as quickly as possible.

The Chairman, Mr Alan Fowlie, and members of the Blue Haven Advisory Committee voluntarily give their time in providing guidance and support to Council in ensuring that the Retirement Village and Aged Care Facility maintain their high standard and reputation. As reported by the Chairman, a number of new members were appointed to the Committee during the past year. The contribution of the Advisory Committee is highly valued and appreciated.
